### **Diamond V Breakfast**

"Breakfast with a Bovine Twist" on Friday featured Tom Edrington, PhD, a ruminant technical specialist and field researcher with Diamond V who focuses on pre-harvest food safety.

The Diamond V-sponsored breakfast, "The Future of Safe and Responsible Beef and Dairy Production", attracted about 500 veterinarians and other AABP conference attendees.

Dr. Edrington noted that both dairy and beef operations can harbor large populations of human pathogenic bacteria, some of which may be resistant to multiple antibiotics. He then pointed out that today consumer opinion was driving dairy and beef marketing. Consumers and public health authorities are concerned about both food safety issues and antibiotic resistance involving "The Big Six" STEC (Shiga Toxin-Producing *Escherichia coli*) as well as the most dangerous Salmonella serotypes.

He noted that the recently implemented Veterinary Feed Directive and the public health threat of resistance to common antibiotics point to a future that requires truly effective, nonantibiotic pre-harvest interventions.

# 2017 Cattle Production Veterinarian Hall of Fame

Yesterday, two deserving veterinarians were inducted into the 2017 Cattle Production Veterinary Hall of Fame.

This year's inductees are Dr. Darrel Johnson, Marshfield, Wis. (Dairy) and the late Dr. Rodney Oliphant, Offerle, Kan. (Beef).
