A DESCRIPTION OF EACH AWARD AND A LIST OF PAST RECIPIENTS FOLLOW:

Boehringer Ingelheim - Bovine Practitioner of the Year Award

This award was established in 1978 and has been given annually. Sponsors of the award have included Diamond Scientific, Syntex Animal Health, Fort Dodge Animal Health and now Boehringer Ingelheim. It consists of a diamond ring and commemorative plaque. Candidates for the award must be bovine practitioners in active practice and the following criteria are evaluated:

1. Recognition for merits in the past year, but recognizing that some things are not completed in one year - it may take two or three years.
2. Consider the volume of practice that is bovine in nature.
3. Quality and competency of veterinary service. What fellow veterinarians think of him/her.
4. Activities in organized veterinary medicine, licensing boards, specialty boards, etc.
5. Case or scientific reports during the current or previous year.
6. Contributions to continuing education in the profession during the past year.
7. Relationship and contribution to the bovine industry (dairy and beef).
8. Legislative activities during current or previous year that affects the cattle industry and bovine practice.
9. Any achievement, or report in previous year that has an impact on the industry in the current year.

Merial AABP Awards for Excellence in Preventive Veterinary Medicine (one beef award and one dairy award)

AABP Amstutz - Williams Award
